## Pickup Schedules

- Annual Spring Pickup: March 16 – May 1, 2026 (Weather depending)
  - Annual Fall Pickup: September 21 – November 20, 2026
- \*\*We will make one pass through the Village sometime during the last week of the month throughout the summer. Please put your yard waste out a couple of days before the last week.

**Allowable Materials** for Annual Pickups: brush, yard and garden waste, concrete, cement blocks, stones, and blacktop. NOTE: Please place brush in a separate pile.

**Not Allowed** for Annual Pickups: stumps, branches over 8" in diameter, whole trees, and building materials (fencing, roofing, lumber, etc.)

- Spring-April 6-18 2026, Fall-September 14-25 2026

## Water Meter Readings

- 2026 Fall meter readings will begin in August 2026

## Water Conservation

- Leaky toilets and faucets cause unnecessary waste of your water.
- Lawn sprinkling is most effective between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.
- Please help us eliminate extra pumping costs.

## Storm Water Management

- Please help us curb unnecessary, harmful liquids and materials, such as fertilizers, pesticides, soaps, and sands, from being washed into the streets and into the storm sewers, as they end up in the river. These conditions cause problems in the river itself, the fish, and other wildlife. Stormwater conservation should be everyone's concern.

## Spring Clean-Up and Projects: Things to Keep in Mind

With Spring finally upon us and warmer weather just around the corner, it's the perfect time to get started on your spring cleaning and outdoor projects. Here are a few important things to keep in mind to ensure a smooth and compliant spring season:

- **No Furniture on the Roadside:** When cleaning out your home or yard, be mindful of where you place items for disposal. It's important not to leave furniture, appliances, or other large items on the roadside unless you have a scheduled bulk waste pickup. Leaving things out on the street could result in fines or complaints.
- **Building Permits for Outdoor Projects:** If you're planning on building a shed, deck, steps, fence, or pool, make sure you check with the Building & Codes Department. **Permits are typically required** for these types of construction projects to ensure they meet local safety codes and regulations.
  - Contact the Clerk's Office for information about permit applications. They can guide you through the process and help you avoid any issues with inspections or penalties.
  - Be sure to also inquire about any zoning restrictions or setback requirements that may apply to your property.
- **Follow Local Guidelines for Waste Disposal:** Make sure you're following local rules for yard waste, recycling, and other items you may need to dispose of during your spring clean-up.
  - Never pour hazardous materials like paint, oil, or solvents down drains, toilets, or storm drains.
  - Take unused or leftover paint to a local hazardous waste disposal facility or a designated drop-off site.

By staying mindful of these guidelines, you'll not only keep your projects on track but also help maintain the cleanliness and safety of your neighborhood.
